General

Classes open to amateur handlers only. Only horses that are offspring of mares nominated through the Silver Sire Futurity Program or with Right to Show certificates are eligible for classes. Eligibility can be verified at www.silversire.com.

Show Office

Entry numbers for fully completed entries will be available at the Silver Sire Auction Booth on Thursday, September 28 from 12:30-3:00 pm and Friday, September 29 from 12:00-2:00 pm.

Stalls

If your horse is entered in the Arabian National Breeder Finals Show and a stall has already been paid for through the Arabian National Breeder Finals show secretary, no additional stall fee is required for your horse for the Silver Sire Show. You must pay for a stall with your Silver Sire entry if your horse is not already entered through Arabian National Breeder Finals.

Class Eligibility

- Auction Yearling Classes: Open only to yearlings that have a Right-to-Show certificate for 2017.
- Open Yearling Classes: Open to yearlings that are the offspring of a mare nominated through the Silver Sire Mare Nomination program during the 2015 breeding season.
- 2 & 3 Year Old Classes: Open to the offspring of a mare nominated through the Silver Sire Mare Nomination program during the 2013 or 2014 breeding season or any 2 or 3 year old horse that has a Right-to-Show certificate for 2014 or 2015.

Showing Requirements

All halter classes will be judged in accordance with the USEF rulebook. Ring entry and presentation will be in the following format:

1. Silver Sire will control in-gate preparation for all classes. The following ring entry will be strictly adhered to:
 - Exhibitors will enter through the Equidome Arena.
 - The gate person will determine when each exhibitor can enter the designated arena.
 - Hazing is only allowed in the designated area at the arena entrance.
 - Only one assistant may accompany the exhibitor from the hazing area to the arena.
 - The assistant can haze/enhance the exhibitor's entry to the arena.
 - The assistant must immediately leave once the exhibitor enters the arena.
2. Horses will either walk or trot into the arena. Immediately upon entry into the arena, the horse will pick up or continue the trot around the arena in a counter-clockwise manner until reaching the ring steward's position.



3. Once all entries are in the ring the exhibitors will be asked to walk on a loose lead along the rail. After the last horse has passed the judges, the exhibitors will reverse direction and walk with their horses on a loose lead back to their original position in line.
4. The first horse in line will begin presentation on the rail until signaled to approach the judges. The entry will proceed in a straight line and at a flat-footed walk to ring center for judging. The exhibitor will stop and present the horse upon instruction from the judges at ring center.
5. Only the first horse in line and the horse “on-deck” will be allowed to prepare for presentation. The only shanking allowed in the remainder of the lineup will be for regaining control of an unruly horse.
6. Horses must be shown in an appropriate show halter with chain. A whip is optional. A horse showing whip marks may be disqualified at the judges’ discretion.

Show Attire

Attire suitable for Arabian In-Hand class presentation is required.

Judges and Scoring

Comparative judging following the Scottsdale Three (3) Judge Scoring System will be used in all classes. An explanation of the scoring system is found on Page 8. A class schedule identifying judge call order will be posted at the Silver Sire Auction Booth at least 24 hours before show start. All individual and class scoring sheets will be made available for viewing on Saturday, September 30 after 12:00 pm. at the Silver Sire Auction Booth.

Rules & Amateur Status

All entries must be shown by a person who is an amateur as defined in the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) rules. Silver Sire Breeders will endeavor to follow the rules and practices as defined by USEF. Silver Sire Breeders is not a sanctioned USEF or Arabian Horse Association (AHA) event and therefore will use the organization’s respective rules for guidance only.

WestWorld Requirements:

COGGINS & HEALTH CERTIFICATE - Mandatory for all horses coming onto the WestWorld property as per Arizona state law: A negative Coggins (*dated within the previous twelve months*) and a Health Certificate (*dated within the previous thirty days*) for all horse originating outside of Arizona. Coggins and Health certificate must match the horse being entered into the show and must include a complete description of horse, that the horse is coming to the show and give location of return trip. Horses will not be permitted on the WestWorld property without the submission of a Coggins and health certificate (for horses from outside of Arizona). Horses caught on property without necessary paperwork will be asked to leave the grounds and will not be given a refund of any fees. **PLEASE SUBMIT A COPY OF THE PAPERWORK WITH ENTRIES AND HAVE ORIGINAL COPY WITH YOU AS INSPECTIONS WILL BE DONE.** Back numbers will not be released until show office has copy.



Entry Requirements & Submittal

All entries must be legible, complete and submitted with all owed fees. All entries, including any returned and resubmitted entries will be charged with a late fee if submitted after the specified dates. Submitted entries **must include:**

1. Complete Entry Form-One horse per entry form.
2. Copy of the registration paper for each horse entered.
3. Copy of the handler's USEF Membership Card with amateur certification.
4. A signed copy of the Silver Sire Assumption of Risk waiver for **each** handler.
5. Copies of the Right-to-Show certificate if entered in an Auction Yearling class. For duplicate certificates and Right-to-Show information contact Paul Richied at (775) 741-0601.
6. Written verification of any Right-to Show transfer.
7. The owner is required to provide their social security number for 1099 tax reporting.

Entries must be postmarked on or before September 6, 2017 to avoid late fees.

There is no stall guarantee for entries received with a postmark later than September 6.

Entries received with a postmark of September 7 or later will be charged with a \$100 late fee.

I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death (“Harm”).

I AGREE to release Silver Sire Breeders, Inc. and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Silver Sire Breeders, Inc. or the Competition

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, included Harm resulting from the negligence of the Silver Sire Breeders, Inc. or the Competition.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Silver Sire Breeders, Inc. and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse at the Competition.

SCOTTSDALE THREE (3) JUDGE SCORING SYSTEM

Section 6 Approved Scoring Systems in AHA Handbook describes the basic three judge system incorporated in this program. However, the article does not describe the exact method of determining award placings other than the Top 10, Champion (or 1st place) and Reserve Champion (or 2nd place). The below procedure is the step-by-step description of this system as it has been practiced since its initial adoption by AHA and as utilized by the Scottsdale Arabian Horse Show.

In general, the three judges in each class are numbered 1, 2 and 3 with judge #1 designated as the "Call" judge. For each class scored by this program, the judges identifying letter code sequence from left to right denotes judge 1, 2 and 3. Each judge will independently place, in order of preference, the number of entries to be awarded. This number may be adjusted by the actual number of entries shown in the class. This adjusted number of award placings will hereafter be referred to as the "Top nth" or simply the "n" placings. If applicable, an additional Reserve horse entry will also be recorded on the judges card. The Reserve entry on the judges' cards are never used in the scoring of a class and may be used only upon the disqualification of a placing entry as described under "DISQUALIFICATIONS."

Step 1: Each of the n class placings is assigned a point value beginning with 1 for the last award (nth placing) and ascending by one per award placing to the award for first or Champion placing. The total point score for each entry will then be calculated as the sum of the points earned by placings over all three of the judges cards.

Step 2: A group of entries to be considered for the "Top nth" or the 1st through nth awards will be selected from those entries having the highest total points. A tie on points for the nth award place will be resolved as described under "RESOLUTION BY CALL JUDGE." All other entries not selected by this step are removed from any further consideration in this scoring system.

Step 3: Candidate horses for Champion or First place are selected from the highest placed horse on each of the judges cards. If the same horse appears more than once in the candidate list, that horse wins. If three different horses appear as candidates, the one having the highest total points will be named the winner. A tie on points will be resolved as described under "RESOLUTION BY CALL JUDGE."

Step 4: Candidate horses for Reserve Champion or Second place are selected from the remaining highest placed horse on each of the judges cards. If the same horse appears more than once as a candidate, that horse is named the winner. If three different horses appear as candidates, the one having the highest total points will be named the winner. A tie on points will be resolved as described under "RESOLUTION BY CALL JUDGE."

Step 5: The winner of each placing from 3rd place down to and including the nth place will be the horse having the highest total points of those remaining in the group of "Top nth" horses selected at Step 2. A tie on points will be resolved as described under "RESOLUTION BY CALL JUDGE."

RESOLUTION BY CALL JUDGE:

A tie on points will be resolved by the placings on the Number One (Call judge) card. The tied horse placed highest on this card wins the placing. If no tied horse appears on the Call judges card, the Number Two judge becomes the Call judge and the procedure is repeated. The procedure is extended to the Number Three judge if necessary. The initial Call judge for each placing resolution is always the Number One judge.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

If a horse is disqualified from a class that has been scored, adjustment to the class placings are made as follows: The number of horses shown is reduced by one only if the disqualified horse was not eligible to participate in the class. The disqualified horse is removed from the scored rankings and each of the horses placing below the disqualified horse are moved up one award place. In all cases where the scored results identified a "Reserve" entry, that horse shall be given the unassigned placing. If the scored results did not identify a "Reserve" entry and Reserve horses were entered on the judges cards, the unassigned placing will be given to (1) any horse appearing as the Reserve entry on more than one card, (2) the Reserve entry on the Call judges card. Under no circumstances will the class be re-scored.
